A1: Paul verbally established it in the new Christians and churches.



1 Timothy 3:14–16

Here is how we read it... 14 I hope to come to you soon, but I am writing these things to you so that, 15 if I delay, you may know how one ought to behave in the household of God, which is the church of the living God, a pillar and buttress of the truth. 16 Great indeed, we confess, is the mystery of godliness: He was manifested in the flesh, vindicated by the Spirit, seen by angels, proclaimed among the nations, believed on in the world, taken up in glory.

A2: Paul wrote letters to the churches to address areas of doctrine.



1 Thessalonians 3:1-13

1 Therefore when we could bear it no longer, we were willing to be left behind at Athens alone, 2 and we sent Timothy, our brother and God's coworker in the gospel of Christ, to establish and exhort you in your faith, 3 that no one be moved by these afflictions. For you yourselves know that we are destined for this. 4 For when we were with you, we kept telling you beforehand that we were to suffer affliction, just as it has come to pass, and just as you know. 5 For this reason, when I could bear it no longer, I sent to learn about your faith, for fear that somehow the tempter had tempted you and our labor would be in vain.



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Titus 1:5

[Paul, writing to Titus, says] This is why I left you in Crete, so that you might put what remained into order, and appoint elders in every town as I directed you

Q: How important was the process of establishing Christians in the apostles doctrine, and how did they do it?

A3: Paul sent trusted people to the churches to address areas of doctrine.



1. Sound doctrine was to be lived out in the churches not just believed.

2. Paul labored to see that the churches were established in "the teaching" and remained strong in the faith.

3. Paul's early letters focus on grounding them in this faith, and his later letters, as well as the general epistles (especially 2 Peter and Jude), focus on remaining firm in faith and contending against false teachers.

EXAMPLE: ROMANS 1:1-6

Paul, a servant of Christ Jesus, called to be an apostle, set apart for the gospel of God, which he promised beforehand through his prophets in the holy Scriptures, concerning his Son, who was descended from David according to the flesh and was declared to be the Son of God in power according to the Spirit of holiness by his resurrection from the dead, Jesus Christ our Lord, through whom we have received grace and apostleship to bring about the obedience of faith for the sake of his name among all the nations, including you who are called to belong to Jesus Christ,

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
